

Computer Science Education Week is celebrated the second week of December. It is an annual call to action to inspire K-12 students to computer science and learn the contributions celebrate of students and teachers. During that week, code.org organizes an annual Hour of Code campaign in hope of getting students around the world engaged in an hour of coding. Tens of millions of students have tried it, including our kindergarten through fifth graders.

There are a wide variety of offerings for students to have a





coding experience. Young children begin with block coding. Block coding is the most basic form of computer programming and a great way for kids to get started. It focuses on teaching coding using visual methods. Rather than having to write complex lines of computer code, with block coding, kids can use visual instruction blocks to create games or moving animations - it uses a simple drag and drop interface. 

Attached is the financial application form for the Father Murphy Catholic High School Tuition Assistance Program. <u>Please fill out this form and return it to:</u> FMS Fund, P.O. Box #64823, Rochester, New York 14624-7223.

The financial awards of up to \$3,000.00 per scholarship per year are granted for up to 4 years from grades nine through twelve to students attending McQuaid Jesuit, Bishop Kearney, Aquinas Institute or Our Lady of Mercy High Schools. Awards may start any year from grade nine through grade twelve and continue throughout a student's high school career.

The criteria for the Father Murphy Catholic High School Tuition Assistance Program are the following:

- 1. Member of Saint Pius Tenth Parish and or graduate of Saint Pius Tenth School.
- 2. Financial need, academic capability and character.

You are encouraged to include a cover letter with this application attesting to the applicant's character and academic capability. Additional information indicating any unusual circumstances that may apply to your situation (recent loss or change of employment, uncovered medical expenses, etc.) may be provided. Documentation regarding special circumstances will be required.

#### All applications must be postmarked by April 15, 2023.

The committee will notify the recipients of the tuition assistance, on or before June 30, 2023.
