BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP

Application Instructions

- 1. Go to online.factsmgt.com/aid.
- 2. If *new parent* to the Diocese of Rochester Catholic Schools network, create an account by setting up a username and password with your information. If *existing parent* at one of our Diocesan schools, use your current FACTS credentials.
- 3. Select the 2024-2025 term.
- 4. Review the FACTS platform information. As with all financial aid applications, there is a \$40 fee to apply. This is <u>not</u> covered by the Diocese of Rochester Department of Catholic Schools. All applicants must pay this fee in order to apply for the scholarship.
- 5. Select Begin Application.
- 6. Click **Add School / Organization**.
- 7. Type in the search box *Building a Brighter Future Scholarship*. Select the checkbox and click *Add*.
- **8.** Click **Save & Continue** to proceed with completing the application.

Under the STUDENT section of the application:

- Enter students **grade level for 2024/2025 School Year**
- **Enter \$1** in the box for: Tuition
- Enter \$1 in the box for: How much of this child's tuition can you and/or the co-applicant pay?
- <u>Enter \$1</u> in the box for: Annual tuition support required from this child's non-custodial parent as a result of legal separation, etc.
- **9.** Continue completing all application sections.
- **10.** Finalize the application by uploading your tax documents and reviewing your submission.
- 11. A Department of Catholic Schools representative will be in contact with you regarding your Building A Brighter Future Scholarship application and next steps with the school at which your current student(s) is enrolled at, or new student(s) may be enrolled.



BUILDING A BRIGHTER FUTURE SCHOLARSHIP

Eligibility

The *Building A Brighter Future Scholarship* provides a tuition assistance scholarship opportunity for eligible students, K-8th grade, across our Diocesan schools for the 2024-2025 academic year. The scholarship supports the Department of Catholic Schools' mission to educate, inspire, and develop children into future leaders of the Church and community.

An online application process will assist in determining eligibility based on the National Standards for Free and Reduced-Priced Lunch. The Department of Catholic Schools will assist **new** families with selecting and enrolling in a school location throughout the application process.

To qualify, you must meet the income standards for Free or Reduced-Price Lunch below:

Applications will be submitted online through the *FACTS Tuition Management* website. Please download the "How to Apply" application instructions guide at dorschools.org/scholarship

All materials will be reviewed by the Department of Catholic Schools in the order they are received. Additional documentation may be requested. After review, the Superintendent will notify the Principals of the selected Catholic schools and inform the families of awards.

Scholarship recipients are required to be in good academic standing and are expected to follow the rules and procedures outlined in the school's Code of Conduct. They should contribute to a positive learning environment and show respect to other people and to property. Students who do not meet these requirements will <u>not</u> be eligible for a scholarship regardless of their financial needs.

This scholarship is for one full school year. Families who have received this scholarship in the past must reapply each year.

Health Office Updates

Happy New Year to all of our St. Pius Tenth families! I can hardly believe we are already in 2024; The fall and Christmas season flew by.

This is my second full year at St. Pius Tenth, and I thank all of you for giving me the privilege to work with and care for your children as their school nurse. It is truly such a loving and tight-knit community here, and I am very blessed to be part of it. There is not a single day that goes by that the students don't make me smile, and even though I see them when they might not feel their best, all of the students, without exception, have always been extremely polite and kind to me which is a true testament to their families and to the school as well.

There are a few health reminders as we are deep in the midst of flu season now. Yearly flu vaccines are recommended by the American Academy of Pediatrics for all children without contraindications starting at 6 months of age. Influenza can cause hospitalization and even death, and vaccination is an important and helpful strategy to protect children and other vulnerable community members, such as the

elderly, from courses of the offices are able vaccination which are much easier to obtain, administer any your child



the flu or severe flu. Pediatrician to schedule appointments, shorter and in order to vaccinations might need.

Since the flu season generally runs until March, it is definitely still helpful to get your child's flu vaccine this winter if you have not already done so. Preventative strategies at home against the flu and other common cold viruses include a healthy diet, good hydration especially with water, restful sleep through the night, and frequent handwashing. Most of our students are vigilant about handwashing, but they may not do so thoroughly. It is helpful for young

children to practice handwashing with soap at home to be reminded that they need to really scrub the soap on all of the fingers and nail beds, for a full 20 seconds (which seems unbearably long to some of our youngest friends!) A good test to make sure children are washing for an adequate duration is to have them sing "Happy Birthday" twice in a row while washing their hands. This ensures that infectious germs will be removed from the skin.

The other timely message to relate is that health screenings will be starting this month. If your student has not had a physical done and on record in the health office within the past year—for grades Pre-K, K, 1st, 3rd, and 5th—it is state law that they be screened by the health office. We complete vision and

hearing screenings first. If there is any concern about a student's results on a vision or hearing screening, a note and report



will be sent home to parents. Also, in January and February, those students without physicals on record will begin brief physical examinations with the medical director of Gates-Chili Central Schools, Jackie Dennison, DNP, in order to check for cardiovascular and respiratory health as well as to be screened for height and weight and scoliosis. These physicals are not as comprehensive as those done by your pediatrician which include a full review of systems, so it is strongly recommended if possible to maintain a once yearly routine exam with your family doctor. They do, however, help us to catch any red flags for student health that may have previously gone undetected.

SPECIFIC SACRAMENTAL READINESS CRITERIA

First Reconciliation—Baptized Roman-Catholic, at least 7 years old, able to understand he/she can sin, have desire to be forgiven and ability to ask for it.

First Eucharist—Baptized Roman-Catholic, who is at least 7 years old, and has prepared and celebrated First Reconciliation, knows the Eucharist is Jesus and wants to be one with Jesus and Church by receiving Communion.




