Busy Scholars in the AIS Room By: Mrs. Cathy Graves

Wow, here we are in June and just about ready to bid another school year good-bye. However, there is still much to be done.

Kindergarten students have been mastering their letters, sounds, and sight words. They have been finishing up their ABC books, working on word family packets, and reading leveled books. How great it is to see their excitement grow as they learn more and more about reading and writing!

First grade students are reading leveled readers and have been learning to search a text for evidence that will help answer reader response questions. We search for and highlight our target words as well. The first graders love to draw and color. We talk about connections we have to our stories and write, draw, and color to show our connections.



Second grade students have been getting extra practice reading the same book their classroom teacher reads with them. This ensures a greater complete understanding of the comprehension focus for the story as well as extra practice with the related phonics work. We also spend more time on glossary words while adding them to our personal "Words to Know" books.

Third grade math students have been practicing solutions to mathematical word problems. They complete word problems using the CUBES method which starts with circling important numbers, underlining the question, putting a box around key math words, evaluating the steps needed to solve the problem, and finally solving and checking their answer.

In ELA, third grade students have been working on phonics elements and comprehension skills. One of our most recent sessions focused on the phonics /k/ sound and its different spellings of, c, k, ch, and ck. We also added the /kw/ sound spelled qu. Our comprehension skill was main idea, and we read a passage about giant pandas to practice this skill.

Fourth graders come to the Learning Center for both math and ELA. In ELA the students are working on phonics and word study skills with a connected reading passage practicing the word study skills. In math the students work on review pages from their daily classroom math lessons.

Finally, fifth graders also come for both math and ELA. Our ELA work has centered around writing skills while the math work matches review work from their daily classroom math lessons.

We're in that final stretch before our break for the summer and then let the **RELAXATQON** begin!

Chil-E Fest Parade Rules and Regulations

FORMATION: Will begin at 3:30 PM on June 24, 2023 rain or shine. You are to convene at the assigned street. **Parade will begin at 4:30 PM.**

<u>PARADE ROUTE</u>: Forming officially at Paul Road near Davis Park, proceeding east on Paul Road to Chili Avenue, turning onto Chili Avenue heading west towards Old Chili Scottsville Road and then turning into the Chili Community Center complex.

<u>PARADE ENDING</u>: The parade will end at the Chili Community Center. Smaller vehicles will be directed to the Archer Field parking/exit area and larger vehicles will be directed around the Community Center and into the front parking lot. Please follow the directions of the onsite parking attendant, not the direction of marcher in front of you. **Refer to attached map.**

<u>REPORTING PROCEDURES</u>: Each organization will report its arrival to the Parade Marshals of their assigned division (the Marshals will be wearing Festival T-Shirts). The Marshals will line each unit in accordance with the "Line of March Orders". Senior Parade Marshals and Aides will be stationed at the Paul Road and Davis Park entrance at 3:30 PM.

FORWARD MOTION AT ALL TIME: Units must complete the entire parade route. Passengers on fenders or hoods will not be allowed. The CONSUMPTION OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES by parade participants is PROHIBITED.

SIGNS, BANNERS AND FLOATS: Must be well designed and in good taste. No vulgarity, characterization or wording detracting from the dignity and honor of the Town of Chili. Floats must be designed to provide full exposure of the driver's head with 180° vision front and on both sides and be equipped with a fire extinguisher.

<u>CANDY:</u> Marchers are allowed to throw candy along the parade route with the exception of the final stretch near the Chili Community Center. This area of the parade is a narrower road so for the safety of parade spectators, candy is not allowed to be thrown in this area, however candy may be handed directly to spectators. **Refer to attached map.**

IF YOUR GROUP HAS CHILDREN MARCHING, PLEASE MAKE ARRANGEMENTS <u>**BEFORE</u>** THE PARADE WITH THE PARENTS AS TO WHERE THE CHILDREN WILL BE WAITING AT THE END OF THE PARADE.</u>

The above rules will be enforced for the safety of both spectators and parade participants.

PARADE PARKING AND SHUTTLE SERVICE: Parking for parade participants will be available at 177 Archer Road and there will be a shuttle service from the Chili Community Center Court (3237 Chili Avenue) to the parade site. *SHUTTLE SERVICE is only available for individuals and groups of ten or less people.*

The shuttle service will run from 3:15-4:10 pm.

****ALL PARADE PARTICIPANTS ARE ENCOURAGED TO STAY FOR THE EVENING FESTIVITIES AT THE CHIL-E FEST.** General Admission parking for the festival is located at 177 Archer Road.


