

# AT ST. PIUS X CHURCH 2022-2023

## GENERAL SACRAMENTAL READINESS CRITERIA



Primary criteria for sacramental preparation is to **celebrate Mass weekly** at St. Pius X. Secondly, that this is **at least the second, consecutive year** that you are enrolled in a Catholic School or a Parish Faith Formation/Youth Ministry Program .



# SPECIFIC SACRAMENTAL READINESS CRITERIA

First Reconciliation—Baptized Roman-Catholic, at least 7 years old, able to understand he/she can sin, have desire to be forgiven and ability to ask for it.

**First Eucharist**—Baptized Roman-Catholic, who is at least 7 years old, and has prepared and celebrated First Reconciliation, knows the Eucharist is Jesus and wants to be one with Jesus and Church by receiving Communion.





**Confirmation**—Baptized Roman–Catholic who is **at least in 8th grade**, and have celebrated First Eucharist and First Reconciliation and have a desire for the Gifts of the Holy Spirit, received in Baptism, to be strengthened to help him/her live a Holy life, can register for the 1st of 2 years of Confirmation

Prerequisite Process. After that is registration for the Immediate Preparation Program.
