Our students will not only be making cards, but we will also collect donations of non-perishable items that are incredibly difficult to get.

toiletries (mouthwash, lotion, sunscreen, deodorant, hair products, etc.) **travel size please**, books/magazines, non-perishable food and snacks (no chocolate or anything that can melt during shipping please) beef jerky/slim jims, dried fruit, nuts, protein bars, powdered drink mixes that can be mixed with water, gum, gummy candy, etc.



Tomorrow's carline will be extra long due to our half day dismissal. Please refer to the carline map above. All cars should enter at the east entrance (near the credit union). PK cars will pass between the school building and the church. The first car should stop at the main entrance to the school. K-5 cars should use the outer loop around the back of the church. First car should wait at the stop sign until motioned forward by school staff. PK dismissal begins at 11:30. K-5 dismissal begins at 11:45.
