Busy Scholars in the AIS Room

Wow, here we are approximately 3/4 of the way through the school year and we are super busy refining our ELA and Math skills!

Kindergarten students have been mastering their letters and sounds while playing sorting games, reading predictable text in letter books, and reinforcing early foundational reading skills with both fiction and non-fiction books.

First and second grade students are using magnet boards or paper work mats with tiles to practice spelling words within various word families. They have also been reading decodable books to help reinforce those word families. We search for and highlight our target words as well as any information that helps us answer comprehension questions.



Third grade math students have been practicing solutions to mathematical word problems. They complete a word problem “Warm Up” prior to the lesson of the day. Lessons recently worked on have been the commutative, associative, and distributive properties, and multiplication using bar diagrams and arrays.

In ELA, third grade students have been working to determine Cause and Effect during reading. Other lessons we have worked on include finding Main Ideas and Key Details as well as supporting answers with text evidence.

Fourth grade ELA students have been working on the reading comprehension skills of Inferencing and Drawing Conclusions. They are also working on written responses that use proper restatements and text evidence for support of their answers.

Finally, fifth grade math students have been working on fractions as well as the mathematical vocabulary that presents itself with each lesson.

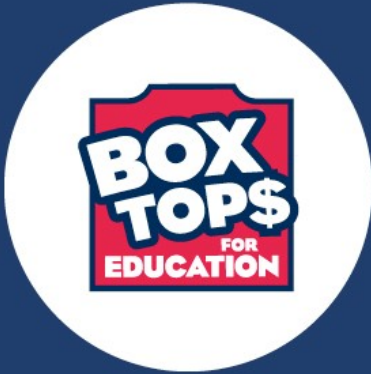

- Applications must be submitted to the Board of Education by Gates Chili residents prior to April 1 per The New York State Education Department Regulation of the year in which transportation is needed in September. New residents to the District have until August 1 to file an application.
- Transportation to/from locations other than the legal residence (i.e. babysitters) must be within the same attendance area as the school legally attended. Per Board of Education policy, written requests for such service must be filed annually in the Transportation Office by July 1 preceding each school year. Alternate location transportation must be on a five-day-per-week basis for the entire school year.
- Transportation will not be provided to private/charter schools when GCCSD is not in session.
- Early dismissals for private/charter schools will be limited to the same number of early dismissals as noted on the Gates Chili school calendar.

As we begin planning for the upcoming school year, we want to inform you of the transportation services for students attending private and parochial locations for the 2022-2023 school year.

Transportation to private and parochial schools include:

- Day to day transportation in the morning and afternoon will remain in place as it currently operates. Student pick up and drop off times will be mailed in late August.
- Transportation will **not** be provided on days that the school district is closed (Superintendent's Conference days, weather related, etc.).
- Transportation will **not** be provided for early dismissals, parents/guardians must provide their own transportation on these days.
- Morning and afternoon transportation will be provided for June exams; however, midday transportation will be provided from school to home only.

Dear Churchville-Chili Family:

Welcome to Churchville-Chili School District. The goal of the District is to provide a safe school bus ride for your child to and from school. We ask that students be ready at the bus stop five minutes before the scheduled time. In order to ensure proper arrival time at school, buses will continue on their way if your child is not outside and ready to board when the bus arrives.

In the interest of the safety of your child, phone calls requesting same day changes in transportation for your child will not be honored.

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM HOME

You do not need to contact us if your children are being picked up and dropped off from their own home. Before school begins, your children will receive a letter with bus information. Each letter will indicate a place for and an approximate time of pick-up and drop off. **Please allow a five (5) to fifteen (15) minute wait window.**

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM CHILD CARE LOCATIONS

The childcare form on the reverse side must be submitted **BEFORE APRIL 1, 2022**. According to state law and to district policy, child care locations must be located within the same school attendance boundary as the student's home school, unless the sitter is licensed by the state of New York. In the latter case, the child care location must be located within the school district boundaries.

In the interest of your child's safety, it is very important that sitter arrangements be consistent and simple. **Varying schedules cannot be accommodated.** The ideal schedule to monitor is one where the student goes to and from the same place every day. If you have any questions about transportation, please feel free to call 293-4544. We look forward to safely transporting your children in the upcoming school year.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS FOR TRANSPORTATION:

Any resident pupil who attends a regular day school program, in grades kindergarten through twelfth, in an approved private, parochial or charter school is entitled to transportation if he or she qualifies according to the following conditions:

A student must live over 1.5 miles from school in order to be eligible for transportation.

If using a babysitter address:

- Must be over 1.5 miles from school.
- Must be Monday – Friday.
- Must be in the City of Rochester.
- Only for students in Grades Kdg – 8th.

The school attended must be within 15 miles of the residence.

NOTE: TRANSPORTATION IS NOT PROVIDED TO ANY ADDRESS OUTSIDE THE CITY OF ROCHESTER.

CHANGE OF SCHOOL OR ADDRESS:

If a student has a change of school or address during the school year, a new application must be completed.

TRANSPORTATION ASSIGNMENTS:

Transportation for elementary students in grades Kindergarten through sixth are on yellow bus.

Transportation for secondary students in grades seventh through twelfth may be yellow bus or Regional Transit Service (RTS) depending on the school.

Eligible applicants will be assigned transportation and notified by mail. If a student is assigned to Regional Transit Service, a temporary bus pass will be sent in the mail and the permanent pass issued by the school.

Due to the many steps necessary to accommodate your request and to provide safe transportation to all students, please note that changes may take 5-10 business days to go into effect.
